Welcome and President's Report:

Katherine Lucas made a motion to approve the minutes from the November Executive Committee Meeting of the Parents Association.

Parent Environmental Action Team

Ellen Pinschmidt, Sam Mason, and Laura Schifter reported on behalf of the Parent Environmental Action Team. These initiatives have been wildly successful, showing a \$14,000.00 savings resulting from composting efforts, and the cafeteria is now 99% trash-free. All lights on campus will be switched to LED bulbs as older bulbs need replacing. The school has received the Bronze Award from the ECO-Schools USA, and the group is working towards Silver.

The goal of the Parent Committee is to amplify school efforts to the broader St. Patrick's community. All are welcome to join the monthly meetings, which are posted in the HoundsTruth. The Parent Committee is currently working on a tri-annual newsletter publication, the first edition to be shared in January.

There is enormous campus-wide enthusiasm and support for the great work of the Environmental Action Team.

Head of School Report

Peter reported that there are only 14 school days remaining until Christmas.

The Professional Day program on Monday was broken into two parts:

- 1.) Time preparing upcoming Reports, and
- 2.) Work on AIMS reaccreditation action plan, re-accreditation action plan
